Call to Worship - Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

As the fountain of all truth, goodness, and beauty, God deserves our trust, honor, and adoration. The call to worship invites us to consider whether we are making God the object of our worship, and stirs us to recenter our lives on him alone.

Words of Confession

Confession means we are completely honest with God and others about our flaws and failures. Instead of hiding in shame or self-defensiveness, we admit our sin, and open ourselves to God's mercy available through Christ alone.

Psalm 32

Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. Blessed is the man against whom the Lord counts no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit. For when I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer. Selah I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord," and you forgave the iniquity of my sin. John 6:28-35, 47-51

28-35 Then they said to him, “What must we do, to be doing the works of God?” Jesus answered them, “This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.” So they said to him, “Then what sign do you do, that we may see and believe you? What work do you perform? Our fathers ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, ‘He gave them bread from heaven to eat.’ ” Jesus then said to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.” They said to him, “Sir, give us this bread always.”

Jesus said to them, “I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst.

47-51 Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.

Questions for Discussion and Application

For Kids

1. **Have you ever wanted something really badly—like a toy or a snack—but still didn't feel happy after you got it?** Why do you think that happens?
2. **Jesus gave the people food before they even asked for it.** What does that show about His love?
3. What are some ways we try to fill our hearts with other things instead of Jesus?
4. **Jesus said, "I am the Bread of Life."** What do you think He meant by that? How is Jesus better than any gift or prize?

For Adults

1. **What does it mean to have a "hungry heart"?** Have you ever felt spiritually unsatisfied even while actively following Jesus? Why do you think that happens?
2. In what ways are we tempted to seek Jesus more for what He can give us than for who He is?
3. **Can you think of a time when God *didn't* give you what you wanted, but used that moment to show you He was enough?** What did you learn?
4. **What are some "junk food" spiritual substitutes people turn to for satisfaction?** How can we identify and turn from those in our own lives?
5. **Jesus invites people to "eat His flesh and drink His blood."** Why do you think He used such strong and confusing language? What do you think He was trying to confront in His listeners?
6. **Jesus said, "This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He has sent."** How do we keep growing in that kind of faith—not just believing Jesus *can* satisfy, but actually living like He *does*?
