Call to Worship - Psalm 96:1-13

96:1 Oh sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth! 2 Sing to the LORD, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day. 3 Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works among all the peoples! 4 For great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised; he is to be feared above all gods. 5 For all the gods of the peoples are worthless idols, but the LORD made the heavens. 6 Splendor and majesty are before him; strength and beauty are in his sanctuary. 7 Ascribe to the LORD, O families of the peoples, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength!

8 Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; bring an offering, and come into his courts! 9 Worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness; tremble before him, all the earth! 10 Say among the nations, "The LORD reigns! Yes, the world is established; it shall never be moved; he will judge the peoples with equity." 11 Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice; let the sea roar, and all that fills it; 12 let the field exult, and everything in it! Then shall all the trees of the forest sing for joy 13 before the LORD, for he comes, for he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness, and the peoples in his faithfulness.

Song of Adoration - Come Praise and Glorify

This song, with deliberate echoes of Ephesians 1, bears a Trinitarian shape, extolling the Father for planning salvation, the Son for purchasing it, and the Spirit for applying it to our lives and securing it until it is accomplished.

Scripture Reading

Ephesians 5:8-21

8 For at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light 9 (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), 10 and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord. 11 Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. 12 For it is shameful even to speak of the things that they do in secret. 13 But when anything is exposed by the light, it becomes visible, 14 for anything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says,

“Awake, O sleeper,
and arise from the dead,
and Christ will shine on you.”

15 Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. 18 And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but **be filled with the Spirit, 19 addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, 20 giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, 21** submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

 - E. *Gratefully*: The attitude is thanksgiving.
“Giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name
of our Lord Jesus Christ” (5:20)

Questions for Discussion and Application

For Kids

1. Why do you think God wants us to sing to Him? What do we want to tell Him when we sing?
2. Can you think of a time when singing made you excited about God? What were you singing about?
3. Why do you think we should sing together as a church family? What does it mean to “sing to each other”?
4. What are some different kinds of songs we sing in church? Why should we sing all types, including happy songs and sad songs?
5. How can you remember to sing to God with your whole heart during church and in your daily life?

For Adults

1. Why do you think singing is such an integral part of Christian worship, as outlined in Ephesians 5:19-20? How does it connect to being filled with the Spirit?
2. How does the historical example of Israel singing after their deliverance from Egypt relate to the way Spirit-filled Christians sing?
3. How does the variety of songs mentioned in Ephesians 5 (psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs) reflect the different emotions and experiences we face in the Christian life?
4. Reflecting on the historical revivals mentioned, such as the Reformation and the Evangelical revivals, how do you see the link between spiritual renewal and an increased focus on congregational singing?
5. Why is it important that our singing, like the one in Ephesians 5, is both directed towards God and each other? How does this dual focus shape our worship experience?
6. What does it mean to sing with a grateful heart, as stated in verse 20? How can this attitude of thanksgiving shape your daily life outside of worship services?

We exist to proclaim the love of Christ in the power of the Spirit for the glory of God.
