Romans 7:18-25b

For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me. Matthew 17:1-13

1 And after six days Jesus took with him Peter and James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. **2** And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became white as light. **3** And behold, there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. **4** And Peter said to Jesus, “Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah.” **5** He was still speaking when, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice from the cloud said, “This is my beloved Son,^[a] with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.” **6** When the disciples heard this, they fell on their faces and were terrified. **7** But Jesus came and touched them, saying, “Rise, and have no fear.” **8** And when they lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Jesus only.

9 And as they were coming down the mountain, Jesus commanded them, “Tell no one the vision, until the Son of Man is raised from the dead.” **10** And the disciples asked him, “Then why do the scribes say that first Elijah must come?” **11** He answered, “Elijah does come, and he will restore all things. **12** But I tell you that Elijah has already come, and they did not recognize him, but did to him whatever they pleased. So also the Son of Man will certainly suffer at their hands.” **13** Then the disciples understood that he was speaking to them of John the Baptist.”

Questions for Discussion and Application

1. Why does Jesus select smaller groups to be with Him at times? Why did He choose the twelve out of all His followers? Why did He often choose three out of the twelve to have special time with Him? What can we learn from this as we disciple one another?
2. Why does God include multiple accounts of the same event in Scripture? Can you think of other places where this happened?
3. What was Peter's mistake? How do we as the church make similar mistakes?
4. Why is it important that we keep Christ as the focus of who we follow?
5. What are some occasions where we could give people a place that only Christ deserves?
6. What does the Father's response to Peter's words communicate about the way He views His Son?
7. The Father said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." What implications does this have on our theology, our worship, our preaching of Jesus?
8. What does Jesus's statement, "Rise and have no fear" communicate about God? How can this be a comfort to us?
9. If John the Baptist and Jesus suffered at the hands of unbelievers, what should we expect as we follow Christ? What should our attitude be?
10. What other passages of Scripture support a high view of Jesus Christ?
