Call to Worship - Psalm 150

As the fountain of all truth, goodness, and beauty, God deserves our trust, honor, and adoration. The call to worship invites us to consider whether we are making God the object of our worship, and stirs us to recenter our lives on him alone.

1 Praise the Lord! Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens! 2 Praise him for his mighty deeds; praise him according to his excellent greatness! 3 Praise him with trumpet sound; praise him with lute and harp!

5 Praise him with sounding cymbals; praise him with loud clashing cymbals!
6 Let everything that has breath praise the Lord!

Words of Confession

Confession means we are completely honest with God and others about our flaws and failures. Instead of hiding in shame or self-defensiveness, we admit our sin, and open ourselves to God's mercy available through Christ alone.

Romans 5:6-11, 18-21

6 For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. 7 For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die— 8 but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. 9 Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. 10 For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. 11 More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation. . . 18 Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. 19 For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous. 20 Now the law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, 21 so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Words of Assurance

1 Peter 1:3-5

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, 5 who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

Song of Preparation - "Holy Spirit, Living Breath"

The song of preparation helps center our hearts and minds on God's Word, reminding us to receive his truth with humility and faith, so that we may respond in obedience and worship.

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Scripture Reading

Ephesians 5:8-21

8 For at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light 9 (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), 10 and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord. 11 Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. 12 For it is shameful even to speak of the things that they do in secret. 13 But when anything is exposed by the light, it becomes visible, 14 for anything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says,

“Awake, O sleeper,
and arise from the dead,
and Christ will shine on you.”

15 Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. 18 And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, 19 addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, 20 giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, 21 submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Sermon: Walk Wisely

Ephesians 5:15-18

Just as you can't walk safely in total darkness, so you can't live wisely without the light of Christ—that is, experiencing his glory (2 Cor. 4:6). As Christians, we have received Christ's light and so we can walk in wisdom. But what does that look like practically? This passage shows us four key aspects of wise living.

I. Wise living means watching your steps. - 5:15

The word “carefully” refers to our *walk*—that is, the sequence of decisions that form the trajectory of our lives. Because Christ shines on them, wise Christians are serious and precise about how they live their lives.

II. Wise living means redeeming the moments. - 5:16

“Time” does not refer to minutes and seconds as commodities to be invested or wasted; rather, it means strategic opportunities to be used. In a dark world in which there are a diminishing number of opportunities, wise Christians seize every opportunity to shine the light.

III. Wise living means knowing Jesus' will. - 5:17

The “will of the Lord” is simply what the King (the Lord Jesus) wants his people to do. Understanding what Jesus wants us to do means not only that we know *what* he wants, but also that we grasp and appreciate *why* he wants it.

IV. Wise living means being controlled by God's Spirit. - 5:18

You cannot be controlled by the Spirit and by alcohol or other mind-altering substances at the same time. Wise Christians yield to the Spirit, whose control is seen in our actions: encouraging each other musically (19), thanking God (20), and submitting to one another (21).

Questions for Discussion and Application

For Kids

1. Why do you think the Bible tells us to be careful about how we live? Can you think of a time when being careful helped you?
2. How can you tell if a decision is wise or not? What should you do if you're not sure?
3. What are some "opportunities" God gives you each day to do something good or to share his love?
4. Why is it important to know what Jesus wants us to do? How can we learn more about his will?
5. What does it mean to be controlled by God's Spirit? How can we tell if we are letting him guide us?

For Adults

1. What does it mean to "live carefully" as a Christian? In what ways can you live more precisely and diligently?
2. What does Christ's shining on us (Ephesians 5:14) have to do with our walking wisely? How does this motivate and enable us to live wisely?
3. What are some specific opportunities God has placed in your life right now that you need to redeem? How can you use them wisely?
4. Does your daily schedule reflect a commitment to making the most of your time for God's purposes? What improvements can you make?
5. The passage contrasts being controlled by alcohol with being controlled by the Spirit. Have you let alcohol control you? Are there other things in your life that are dulling your spiritual sensitivity?
6. How does your worship—through singing, thankfulness, and submission—reveal whether you are being led by the Spirit?
7. If someone looked at your life, would they describe you as a person who walks wisely? What would you want to change so that your life better reflects Christ's light?

We exist to proclaim the love of Christ in the power of the Spirit for the glory of God.
